

## PayPal's SASB Index

This index maps our latest disclosures from the 2022 Global Impact Report and other public documents to the IFRS Foundation's SASB standards, which aim to provide voluntary, industry-specific standards for companies to disclose financially material sustainability topics and related performance metrics. Below we report on relevant key topics from the Software & IT Services and Consumer Finance industry standards. We will continue to evaluate opportunities for future reporting enhancements.
